

MOONLIGHT GIFT BOX

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Supplies:

Card/Paper: Moonlight Designer Series Paper Stack, Lost Lagoon, Blackberry Bliss, Hello Honey & Whisper White Cardstock

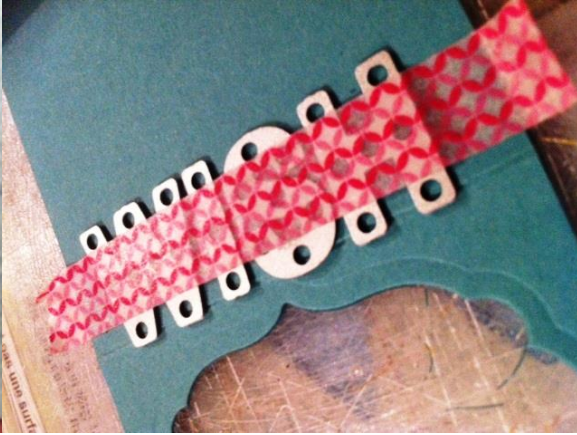
Accessories: Kraft Gift Box, Gold Twine, 5/8" Organza Ribbon, Linen Thread, Basic Pearls, Watercolour Wonder Washi Tape, Dimensionals

Tools: Big Shot, Magnetic Plate, Simply Scored Tool, Labels Framelits Dies, Little Letters Dies, Bitty Butterfly Punch, Elegant Butterfly Punch

Instructions:

1. Put together your box as per the instructions. Adhere the pieces of Moonlight Designer Series Papers to all four sides and to the lid. The four side pieces are 3 3/8 x 2 3/8 inches (8.5cm x 6cm) and one for the top is 3 3/8 x 3 3/8 inches (8.5cm x 8.5cm).
2. Score your Belly Band at 1, 3 1/2, 7 1/8, and 9 3/4 inches. (Metric 2.5cm, 9cm, 18cm, 24.5cm)
3. Die cut a window using the second smallest Label Framelit Die out of the front of your belly band (either of the 2 1/2 inch (6.5cm) tall sections).
4. Place the Little Letters Dies so they are just overlapping the crease line (as shown by your Demonstrator), and cut only to the crease line. Remove the dies carefully, pushing the cardstock out of the letters using the small holes on the dies. Stand the letters upright.
5. Add the small extension to the end of your belly band and adhere around the box securing with a bit of the Watercolour Wonder Washi Tape.
6. Die cut two of the smallest Labels Framelits out of the matching cardstock and glue them to the front of your box, slightly offset. Use two Dimensionals to adhere the White Label framelit, leaving a gap in the middle for your ribbon. Run the ribbon around the box and under the white Label Framelit and tie to the side.
7. Place two Pearls on the white Framelit as shown. Punch an Elegant Butterfly (larger butterfly) out of the Moonlight DSP and adhere to the front using a Dimensional.
8. Punch two of the Bitty Butterflies out of two different prints (or turn one over) and adhere them just in the centre. Tie the Linen Thread around them both, knotting at the top for a "head" and leaving tails for the antennae. Adhere to the larger butterfly as shown.

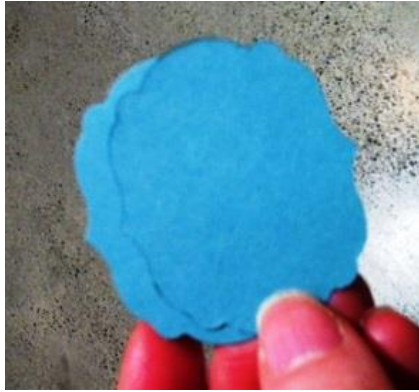




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
